Why Join? What does membership mean? Do I have to believe certain things?

• Many of us find our relationships become deeper, richer and fuller for having made a covenantal commitment to membership. Something important happens to us when we decide to make a public declaration about our involvement and our faith.

"This is my spiritual home. These are my people. This is where I want to anchor my journey!"

- As a congregational church, members vote on congregational matters during meetings such as budget, election of officers and board members, the calling of pastors, and other policies. Sharing of our time, talent, and treasure are essential.
- As a part of the United Church of Christ, you also have a voice in the greater church.
- As a member, we make Covenantal Promises to God, to each other, and to our faith.
- We view creeds and statements of faith as "testimonies not tests.

How do I get started?

- **Jump In wherever you feel most comfortable!** By attending our worship services, joining us for fellowship, or participating in any of our programs, you've already started your journey to becoming a part of our church family. We respect each individual's spiritual journey, "No matter who you are, or where you are on life's journey, you are welcome here!"
- Attend an "Exploring Membership" gathering! This is a time to meet members, hear why they decided to join, share stories, learn a bit about our church's congregational history and our relationship to the United Church of Christ denomination.

Do I have to join to participate of the life of the church? No. You can participate in nearly every aspect of the church's life without becoming a member. We are happy you are here!

<u>What's the process?</u> Once you've decided to become a member, you'll join our congregation during one of our Membership Sundays. We introduce and welcome new members through what we call the "*Right Hand of Fellowship*." New members and the congregation make Promises to each other, to care for and support one another on our spiritual journey together. We will have follow up meetings to help you discover ways that you can bring your gifts and passions into the ministry.

We believe in God, the Eternal Spirit,
